

ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

KaNA Fuddy Prakoso is an accomplished artist and educator, known for her contributions to the art world. She graduated from Grafis Art at the Indonesia Institute of the Arts in Yogyakarta, showcasing her commitment to developing her artistic skills and knowledge. Alongside her artistic pursuits, she is also one of the Founding Members and current directors of Ruang Garasi, an art space located in Jakarta (@ruang_garasi).

Throughout her career, KaNA Fuddy Prakoso has actively sought opportunities to exhibit her artwork in various locations, both within Indonesia and abroad. In 2009, she participated in the Fine Art International exhibition held in Monastir, Tunisia, located in North Africa. In 2015, she had the honor of showcasing her work as an Indonesian artist archipelago in Milan, Italy, as part of an exhibition organized by Imago Mundi and the Luciano Benetton Foundation.

Her artwork has been displayed at the Fine Art and Ceramic Museum in Jakarta, offering visitors a chance to appreciate her talent and creativity. In 2019, she was invited as an artist to the Sketsa Urban Festival of Sketch, a prestigious event held at the National Gallery of Indonesia.

KaNA Fuddy Prakoso's artistic achievements extend internationally as well. Her work was featured at the 28th Seoul International Art Festival, held at the Hanguk Art Museum in Seoul, South Korea, in 2021. In 2022, she participated in the "Wadon" group exhibition at the Benteng Vredeburg Museum in Yogyakarta, showcasing her artwork alongside fellow artists. She also took part in the "Manifesto Transposisi" exhibition at the Kebangkitan Nasional Museum in Jakarta, further solidifying her presence in the local art scene.

Additionally, her talent led her to participate in the 19th Asian Art Biennale 2022, held in Bangladesh at the National Art Gallery Bangladesh and Shilpakala Academy in Dhaka, where she contributed her artwork to the larger artistic conversation. Moreover, she was involved in the "Art the Fact" group exhibition at the Museum Kebaharian in Jakarta, allowing her work to be displayed and appreciated by a diverse audience.

KaNA Fuddy Prakoso's artistic biography reflects her dedication to her craft and her desire to share her creations with the world. As an artist and educator, she continues to make a significant impact in the art community, inspiring others with her unique vision and artistic prowess.

Description of "Neighborhood" (China ink and Acrylic on Cardboard, 185x225cm, 2023)

In the midst of the hustle and bustle of the big city, often perceived as cold and individualistic, there is an inspiring story of a group of people who decided to change this perception through the use of cardboard.

The story begins with city dwellers who felt that deep social connections were becoming increasingly rare in their lives. They came from various cultural and social backgrounds, but they shared one common goal: to create a sense of togetherness amid the city's chaos.
